

#### Situation

CCAG highlighted a dependency between the Code Bodies' change processes and the MHHSP Change Process if a change will impact the MHHS Design.

## Complication

Both Code and Programme change processes operate independently, although the MHHS Design can only be changed through a MHHSP CR.

There are no principles or process which sets out how the dual governance should operate.

### **Governing Thought**

To give industry direction, principles and process steps should be developed and agreed with CCAG.





#### **Code Change and Programme Change Control**

### MHHS Programme

MHHSP owns and manages the MHHS Design/Programme Artefacts

Any Programme Participant can raise a Change Request (CR) to change the Programme Artefacts

Accepted CRs are sent by the MHHS Change Board to the relevant Programme decision group to be assessed and for a recommendation to SRO for decision\*

### Code Bodies

Code Bodies own their Code Artefacts Signatories to the respective codes\*\* can raise a modification or Change Request to amend the Code Artefacts

The modification or CR will follow the individual Code change process, resulting in a change being presented to Panel or Ofgem for decision

\*Programme changes above agreed thresholds are to be sent by the SRO to Ofgem for decision \*\* Note under the REC, anyone can raise a change



# Principle and High-Level Governance Steps

Following discussions with Ofgem -

# Principle

If a change to the MHHS Design is required, Code Bodies must not progress change, but direct the change raiser to the Programme to raise a Programme CR

# Steps


If a Code change may impact the MHHS Design or other MHHS Artefacts, industry must...

- 1. Engage the Programme to raise a Programme CR
- 2. If the Programme CR is approved, the Programme will issue the implementation date
- 3. If the change to Design requires a change to Code, this will be managed through the Programme Code workstream





#### Code Change and Programme Change Process (Strawman)









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# **Code Consultation Update**

# CCAG Related Steps – Heads up for May's meeting

- 1. By 9 May CDWG will be requested to send to CCAG the Code Artefacts for recommendation
- 2. CCAG recommended Code Artefacts will remain 'live documents' which means they are not baselined until M6 final approval
- 3. The Code Artefacts remain in the public domain at all times for transparency and customer reference
- 4. Any contentious areas can be ring fenced, tracked and picked up through the mop-up process (to avoid delaying a whole tranche)
- 5. There are no plans for 'repeat' consultations, although the mop-up and finalisation/consistency tranches provide for consultations
- 6. Before M6 any changes to Design (through a CR) will need to be reflected in the Code Artefacts



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


