## Key Discussion items

Area	Discussion
<b>Minutes and Actions</b>	<p>The CCAG reviewed outstanding actions, updates for which can be found within the meeting papers. All actions were closed.</p> <p>The Programme took an action to embed a link to the Code Change Control Overview on the Collaboration Base in the Headline Report (<b>ACTION CCAG19-01</b>). The Relationship Between Code Governance and Programme Change Control can be found on the Collaboration Base <a href="#">here</a>.</p> <p>The CCAG discussed minutes and headline reports of the May CCAG meetings. The Programme took an action to amend the commentary regarding Code Drafting Mop Up Tranche consultation (<b>ACTION CCAG19-02</b>). Specifically, the reference to the REC consultation was considered misleading. The BSC intend to issue a consultation on code drafting outputs of the issues group in January 2024. RECCo noted that the MHHS Code Drafting Mop Up Tranche would be consulting in March 2024. <a href="#">Elaxon and RECCo are committed to ensuring open dialogue to support the effective management of any cross-code impacts or requirements.</a></p> <p>The minutes and headline reports of the May CCAG meetings we approved, subject to one amendment, as per CCAG19-02 (<b>DECISION CCAG-DEC29</b>).</p>
<b>Code Drafting Triage and Assurance Process</b>	<p>The Programme provided an overview of the Code Drafting Triage and Assurance Process. The CCAG recognised that the triage and assurance process is iterative and will develop as the programme progress. The Programme discussed the difference between design queries and out of design scope. It was noted a design query relates to gaps in the design, whereas out of design scope relate to issues outside of the design, for example legacy issues. It was noted that items will be supported by supplementary reasoning and explanation, which will provide clarify where item categories do appear to overlap.</p>
<b>Code Artefact Tracker</b>	<p>The Programme presented new changes to the Code Artefact Tracker. The Programme took an action to update Code Artefact Tracker with Artefact Descriptions where required (<b>ACTION CCAG19-03</b>).</p> <p>The programme clarified the Code Artefact Tracker is available on the Collaboration Base.</p>
<b>Horizon Scanning Log</b>	<p><b>BSC</b></p> <p>P432 – This Modification proposes to align the BSC definition of an Advanced Meter with that in the Standard License Conditions and to set explicit Half Hourly Settlement obligations for Current Transformer. Advanced Meters ahead of the migration to Market-wide Half-Hourly Settlement (MHHS). Decision date from Ofgem is expected 31 July 2023.</p> <p>P441 – It was noted the Cross-code change package timeline has been agreed. A meeting with MHHS to discuss MHHS impacts is needed in July 2023. Current view is no impact on design as complex sites not in current design artefacts. Code drafting will need to incorporate P441 changes.</p> <p>The Programme clarified as per the Migration Strategy and agreed policy position of Programme Steering Group, complex sites will not be migrated until post M14 in order to avoid reverse migration. This will be managed via the Migration Control Centre.</p> <p>P442 – This Modification seeks to allow correct reporting of chargeable volumes to the EMRS company for SVA Metering Systems that record both exempt supply and licensed supply through the addition of a new third-party role. It will impact the reporting of data into EMRS</p>

	<p>which has currently been defined as a MDS responsibility. A solution agreed has sought to avoid MHHS impacts and a meeting with MHHS to validate this position needed immediately.</p> <p>P455 – This Modification seeks to establish a more cost effective and efficient method for delivering Third Party Access on private networks that include domestic and small business customers. It does so by enabling aggregated meter data from sub meters on private networks to be submitted into Settlement in lieu of data from Settlement meters installed at the Boundary Point.</p> <p>The CCAG discussed solution development and whether this change would be subsumed by Ofgem. It was noted a work group has been mobilised in July to discuss this change, impact on MHHS and registration systems in more detail.</p> <p><b>DCUSA</b></p> <p>The following updates were taken as read by the CCAG.</p> <p>DCP414 – Decision is expected to be in the Interim Release 3 in August 2023.</p> <p>DCP441 – De-energised sites, with site-specific billing, are able to retain capacity on the network without being charged for it under the current methodologies.</p> <p><b>REC</b></p> <p>R0083 and R0083A – R0083 seeks to replace the Data Items which make up the top line of the Supply Number format, to accommodate that the existing Data Items will no longer be available under the new Market-wide Half Hourly Settlement design. R0083A seeks to remove the top line. It was noted a consultation has been issued on 09 June 2023 and responses are due by the end of 30 June 2023.</p> <p>An action was taken for the REC Code Manager to feed into opportunities to consolidate codes and consider uppercase and lowercase character requirements (<b>ACTION CCAG19-04</b>).</p> <p>R0097 – The REC Code Manager noted the Final Change Report will be presented for decision at the Technical Expert Panel on 28 June 2023. An action was taken for REC to share R0097 decision outcome with MHHS PMO, Andrew Margan and Chris Welby (<b>ACTION CCAG19-05</b>).</p> <p>R0101 – The Change Proposal approved for implementation in the 30 June 2023 release. It was noted the approved solution does not include the additional SIP to MEM Scenario Variant for the D0139 Confirmation or Rejection of Energisation Status Change.</p> <p>R0109 – New item which proposes that the required timescale for the electricity Meter Technical Details to be sent to the Supplier from the MEM should be shortened to 2 Working Days to align with the timescales for gas. It was noted that the priority has been assessed as low and the change is on hold.</p> <p>R0121 – New item. which will improve (Process Types and escalations) operational efficiency for users of the Secure Data Exchange Portal system, which offers opportunities for REC Parties to enhance how Consumer-related queries are dealt with (time and accuracy). An escalation for missing Meter Technical Details is being considered in the scope of this change. It was noted that priority has been assessed as medium and is awaiting a Change Lead to be assigned.</p>
<b>CCAG Reporting</b>	<p>The Programme provided updates on code drafting activities against approved code drafting plan, including updates on Registration and BSC Central Services consultation, and updates on Interfaces, Qualification, and Migration code drafting. Of note, the registration consultation is now closed, and comments are being triaged and actioned. The BSC Central Services consultation is open and closing on 12</p>

	<p>July 2023. More widely, Migration, Governance/Qualification and DCUSA Consequential Code Change Tranche 3 is on track. In addition, Interface/Data Specification Tranche 3 is at risk due to Design updates.</p> <p>The Supplier Agent Representative challenged whether the timings of interface and transition consultations will have an impact on industry. The Programme advised that the impact on industry of consultations will be considered for each consultation and combined where possible.</p> <p>The Supplier Agent Representative (Independent Supplier Agent) queried whether the mitigation for R425 - Performance Assurance Regime for the TOM will not be delivered in line with Ofgem's Transition Timetable is correct. The Programme accepted the mitigation requires an update. An action was taken by the Programme to update the RAID Log to better reflect qualification mitigation (<b>ACTION CCAG19-06</b>).</p> <p>The CCAG approved amendments the Code Drafting Plan (<b>DECISION CCAG-DEC29</b>). This proposed to consult on 11 October 2023 rather than 18 August 2023 to incorporate bulk of known interface related design changes. Interface replan proposal does impact Interface and BSC validation rules delivery but does not impact Governance and Qualification and Migration code drafting industry consultations planned for 18 August 2023.</p>
<b>CDWG Update</b>	<p>The Programme provided an overview of the Tranche 1 code drafting consultation, which focussed on Metering Services and Data Services code drafting. An overview of response metrics and updates made to code drafting artefacts following the consultation was provided alongside an overview of Programme governance mechanisms which underpin the process.</p> <p>The CCAG were advised the key tasks for CDWG in July 2023 cover the Registration triage and responses activity, an update on the BSC Central Services consultation and discussion on the Interface delivery date.</p>
